FOUNDATIONAL PILLAR - Operational Expectations

EXPECTATION

It is the will of the Board that schools and programs effectively meet the student's needs.

DEFINITIONS

School or program viability study – a process to engage stakeholders to explore ways of increasing a school or program's effectiveness. Viability studies are not a prerequisite for school closure.

REQUIREMENTS AND LIMITS

- 1. The Superintendent shall monitor the effectiveness and viability of schools and programs in the Division.
- 2. The Superintendent shall report to the Board at its October Board meeting when the Superintendent determines that circumstances exist which support the consideration of a viability study for a school or program. The report should describe the following
 - a. student access to a quality basic education program
 - b. the economic viability of the operation of the school or program
 - c. the existence of a safe physical environment for students
 - d. utilization of the school building(s)
 - e. enrolment trends and projections.
- 3. If, upon receipt of the report, the Board, by motion decides to initiate a viability study of the school or program, the Superintendent shall present a plan, for Board approval, that includes
 - a. membership of the committee that will be designated to study the school or program viability
 - b. the timelines for the study, including when the final report is to be presented to the Board
 - c. plans to engage the community in order to receive the community's input, suggestions, and advice and to explore alternatives that could increase viability.
- 4. The Superintendent shall present the findings of the Committee to the Board as soon as is practically possible.
